We know that caring for a pet can be difficult, especially in times of financial hardship or illness. If you are considering needing to surrender your pet or are looking for affordable options to continue to care for them, please try using the resources below. This list includes surrender prevention options such as free or low-cost pet care, medical care, and food. It also includes surrender resources if you've exhausted the above options (Bideawee is a limited intake shelter depending on capacity, so if we are unable to take your pet in, please reach out to the resources below as well.)

BEHAVIORAL SUPPORT

GOODPUP: This is a virtual service where dog behaviorists evaluate the behaviors of any dog and come up with training plans, ranging from basic obedience to significant behavioral issues. With Bideawee's code, you can get your first week completely free, no future charges required. After that, it is a pay per week service with a 10% discount for life and you can continue, pause, or cancel at any time. Once you use this link, you can sign up for a behavioral consultation via phone/video and should be able to get your first session within 24-48 hours. Once you have completed your first week, you can either continue with 10% off for life through Bideawee and pay as needed, or you can end your account, so you don't need to pay for the next week. The behaviorists will give advice and can come up with a training plan, as well as coach you through the training and tailor the plan as needed. With GoodPup you also get access to chat with behaviorists 24/7 for support in addition to weekly meetings for them to evaluate and tailor the plan. If you are open to trying this service to prevent surrendering your dog but the cost is a barrier for you, please reach out to let us know and Bideawee may be able to help with this.

ASPCA ANIMAL HOSPITAL IN NYC: The ASPCA Animal Hospital is an urgent care facility providing critical services for animals who have been victims of cruelty and neglect, and for pet cats and dogs whose owners are experiencing financial challenges. Eligibility: NYC residents with an annual household income under \$50,000 and a qualifying medical condition*. TEMPORARY CARE/ DAY-TO-DAY RESOURCES

PAWS NY: HOUSE CALL PROGRAM: If you are an older adult or are living with an illness or disability, and you are struggling with the day-to-day care of your pet, then PAWS NY might be able to assist. The House Call Program is the core program through which PAWS NY volunteers provide on-site home visits to clients. Visits generally include:

- Dog walking
- Litter maintenance
- Medication administration
- Provision of food and water

Once a client becomes part of the House Call Program, PAWS NY may be able to provide holistic, wrap-around pet care services as needed, including:

- Foster and Emergency Care Program: Emergency foster or pet care when a client is hospitalized or as part of disaster response in specific instances.
- Pet Pantry: Distribution of food and supplies to clients and pets.
- Veterinary Care Program: Funding to cover the cost of veterinary care for clients and a partnership network with vets that provide discounted services.
- Referral Network: Referrals to other low-cost or free pet care services, as well as social services.

ANIMAL CARE CENTERS OF NYC (ACC):

Through the ACC Admissions Department and agreements with partnering organizations, ACC is able to offer a variety of resources to assist pet owners in keeping their pets. Resources include:

- Reduced or free routine veterinary care, including spay/neuter
- Funding for emergency veterinary care
- Behavior advice and trainer referrals
- Supplies (food, litter, harness, etc.)
- Assistance with tenant/landlord disputes, including NYCHA issues
- Assistance for individuals entering DHS temporary housing
- Assistance for military deployment
- Assistance for pet owners that are hospitalized, incarcerated, escaping domestic violence, or experiencing similar situations

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE RESOURCES

URBAN RESOURCE INSTITUTE (URI): URI shelters provide safety and refuge to over 600 domestic abuse survivors, giving them the space and support they need to heal and rebuild their lives. URI's People and Animals Living Safely (PALS) program also offers 50 animal-friendly units across four shelters, so survivors do not have to abandon a beloved pet in order to enter a URI shelter.
